FIRST AND FOREMOST



Do you feel pressured into doing things? Are you being exploited, threatened or assaulted? You can talk to a professional and be protected. The contact details of various associations and organisations can be found in this booklet.

The exploitation of women, men and children can take many forms that are punishable by law: sexual abuse, domestic slavery, forced begging, forced labour, coercion to commit crimes, forced marriage, etc.

STAY SAFE

Stay vigilant, especially if someone, whether it be a man or a woman:

Tries to obtain your identity documents (other than the authorities and authorised associations),

Tries to take your phone, computer or any other means of communication,

Tries to separate you from your family or loved ones,

Forces you to engage in an activity or have sex (including to pay off a debt),

Promises to help you (with transport, food, etc.) or offers administrative, legal and social support in exchange for money,

Makes unrealistic promises to you,

Makes you work but doesn't pay you or keeps you in poor working conditions.

IF YOU ARE IN IMMEDIATE DANGER, YOU CAN ASK THE POLICE OR THE FRENCH GENDARMERIE FOR HELP, OR CALL 17 OR THE EUROPEAN EMERGENCY NUMBER 112.








PROTECT YOUR INFORMATION



Your personal information and identity documents are sensitive materials and must be kept in a safe and confidential place. Take a photo of them and e-mail yourself a copy as this could help you if you lose them. Only share them with official authorities and organisations if they ask you to do so.

Malicious people may try to build trust in order to take advantage of you and your situation. Never share your personal information or accept offers from strangers on social media or unverified websites.



KEEP IN TOUCH WITH YOUR LOVED ONES

Stay in touch with your family or loved ones. Don't get separated from your family or loved ones.

Keep your phone on you at all times.

Memorise the phone number of someone you trust and agree on a code word that you can use if you are ever in danger and are unable to speak freely.

USE OFFICIAL CHANNELS

In France, official and free services have been set up to welcome you and provide care and support.

Use the services offered by authorities or official associations, including when looking for accommodation. Ask for the names and official details of the organisations and associations that offer you help.

Use public transport. If you get into someone's vehicle, take a photo of the number plate and send it to someone you trust.

If you are staying with someone outside of the official accommodation channels, ask this person to see their details (identity and address).




WHO SHOULD YOU CONTACT

Organisations that offer direct help to victims of trafficking.

National Ac.Sé scheme	Offers accommodation and support with relocating to victims of trafficking who are in danger in the local area or are very vulnerable. Runs a resource centre for professionals who are in contact with victims.
"Together against human trafficking" collective	The collective is a network created for a more effective fight against all forms of this denial of human rights. Created by Secours Catholique in 2007, it brings together 28 French associations that are either directly or indirectly involved with victims.
International Organization for Migration (IOM)	Offers reintegration support to victims of trafficking who want to return to their home country (enquire about eligible countries).
Secours catholique Caritas France	Listens to, welcomes, guides and supports people at risk of, and victims of, human trafficking.
Urban Exchange Network for Fighting Against Exploitation (Ruelle)	Offers social, psychological and legal support.
Committee Against Modern Slavery (CCEM)	Offers social, psychological and legal support.
L'amicale du Nid (AdN)	Provides comprehensive support to people involved in prostitution.

Provides comprehensive support to people involved in prostitution.

Mission of Intervention and Sensitisation against Human Trafficking (Mist)

Supports victims of procuring or trafficking for the purposes of sexual exploitation.

Liberation for those in captivity (Aux captifs, la libération)

Offers support to people on the streets and those living on the street.

ALTHEA – L'Appart

Takes in, listens to and provides support to any person (adult or minor) who is in, or at risk of, prostitution, regardless of whether this is in a context of human trafficking.

The Paloma Association

A community health organisation supporting prostitutes with regard to risk prevention and offering comprehensive social support (health, social, administrative/legal).

ARS Antigone

Fights against the exclusion of prostitutes. Helps victims of human trafficking.

Off the Street (Hors la rue)

Identifies and supports unaccompanied foreign children who have been trafficked.

Ecpat France – mission Calais

Offers legal, social and psychological support for unaccompanied and homeless minors, including minors at risk or victims of trafficking.

Taking action to fight underage prostitution (ACPE)

Offers support to minors who are victims of sexual exploitation and their loved ones (psycho-educational, legal support).

L'amicale du Nid (AdN)

Provides comprehensive support to minors involved in prostitution.

ALTHEA - L'Appart

Takes in and listens to minors in, or at risk of, prostitution, as well as providing them with guidance and support.
