

## Open Call for Volunteers UNHCR Representation in Georgia

UNHCR Georgia is establishing a **Volunteers Pool** to strengthen engagement with forcibly displaced and stateless communities. We invite motivated, trusted, and skilled individuals to apply and contribute to community outreach, communication, and a range of short-term, skills-based activities.

Volunteers will serve as a bridge between UNHCR and communities by facilitating communication and providing broader, hands-on support across outreach, operational, and community engagement initiatives. Through their contributions, they will help ensure that voices of forcibly displaced and stateless people are heard and that UNHCR services and programs remain responsive to community needs.

### **About the Volunteers Pool**

Selected volunteers will form a diverse and flexible pool of individuals, representing different languages, age groups, gender, and community backgrounds, with additional candidates potentially engaged based on needs and available skills.

Volunteers will be engaged on a flexible, needs-based basis and contribute according to their areas of expertise. Activities may include:

- Community consultations, outreach, and engagement activities
- Trend reporting and community feedback collection
- Translation, interpretation, and communication support
- Awareness-raising on asylum procedures and available services
- Logistical and operational support for meetings, events, and field activities
- Cultural and community engagement initiatives
- Contributions aligned with individual skills (e.g., communication, marketing, IT, facilitation, coordination, etc.)

### **Who Can Apply?**

We welcome applications from:

- All individuals aged 18 and above who are legally residing in Georgia.
- Individuals trusted and respected within their communities
- People fluent in English and relevant community languages
- Individuals with diverse professional or practical skills (e.g., communication, IT, logistics, translation, community work, etc.)
- Those interested in contributing to community engagement and humanitarian work

### **Selection Criteria**

Applicants should demonstrate:

- Strong communication and interpersonal skills
- Trust and positive standing within their communities
- Motivation to contribute through their skills and expertise
- Relevant competencies or experience in areas such as communication, IT, logistics, facilitation, education, or community engagement
- Availability to participate in briefings and assigned activities on a flexible basis

- Respect for confidentiality, safeguarding, and ethical principles  
Diversity in gender, age, nationality, language, and background will be prioritized.

### **Engagement Modality**

- Engagement is flexible and task-based, depending on operational needs
- Volunteers will be engaged according to their availability and specific skill sets
- Opportunities will be provided to contribute across different areas aligned with the Core Pillars of Engagement
- Participation is voluntary and non-contractual

### **What Volunteers Will Receive**

- Initial and refresher training provided by UNHCR
- Certificates of participation and recognition of contribution
- Opportunities to gain experience in community engagement and humanitarian response
- Enhanced visibility through participation in activities, events, and community initiatives
- Opportunities to engage in meaningful work supporting forcibly displaced and stateless communities and strengthening community voice
