

BEWARE OF FRAUDULENT MESSAGES ON SOCIAL MEDIA!

The United Nations High Commissioner for Refugees (UNHCR) is aware of fraudulent messages on resettlement being circulated via social media platforms including Facebook, Twitter, and WhatsApp. Refugees are defrauded into believing they may be selected for resettlement as part of a global scheme for 2021. UNHCR is alerting the public about such fraudulent messages which claim to be issued by or in association with the Organization and/or its officials.
