About MBBS-MGHD

- 6.8-year dual degree: Bachelor of Medicine, Bachelor of Surgery (MBBS) + Master of Science in Global Health Delivery (MGHD).
- Integrated medical education with a focus on One Health, social determinants of health, and community-based care.
- Principles of gender equity, inclusiveness, and social justice are embedded in the curriculum.
- Learning methods: interactive lectures, flipped classrooms, team-based and case-based learning, simulation, and clinical teaching.
- Graduates are trained to lead health systems and repair inequities in care, beyond individual patient treatment.
- Fully accredited by the Higher Education Council (Rwanda) and the East African Council of Higher Education.

Application Process

- Apply online through the UGHE Admissions Portal.
- International applicants must validate their qualifications with NESAI (National Examination and School Inspection Authority).
- Required documents: transcripts, personal statement, 2 recommendation letters, and demographic information.
- All applications will be reviewed by the Admissions committee.
- Selected candidates take an entrance exam and an interview.
- Shortlisted applicants are invited for interviews.
- Opening date: **29 September 2025**.
- Closing date: **30 January 2026, 5:00 PM (CAT)**.

What you need to Know

- All students live at UGHE's Butaro campus.
